



Welcoming letter to Axxell Brusaby

Welcome to Finland and Axxell Brusaby! Date

Through this exchange, you will learn sheep farming and Finnshep in Finland and an introduction to what a working day at a sheep farm looks like. You will meet animal care/livestock and dairy and study with students from other European countries, visit local companies and practice your soft skills both at school visits and at local companies and farms.

The theme for your visit to Finland is Finnsheep. There will be both a practical and theoretical approach to this topic, with classroom lessons as well as study visits and opportunities to take care of the sheep at Axxell Brusaby.

For the two weeks you'll be staying at the boarding school of Axxell Brusaby located in the small village Kimito located in the Finnish archipelago. You will share room with another student and have cooking facilities available. You are also able to eat breakfast, lunch and dinner at school for a small cost. Breakfast is served from 7.15-8.25, lunch from 11.30-12.30 and dinner from 16.00-17.00. During the weekends the school's kitchen is closed, but if you want you can ask for and get packed lunches for the weekend on Friday at lunchtime (remember to ask for the packed lunches if you want to have them)

When you arrive at Helsinki airport you will have to take the train to Salo and there you will be picked up by your contact person (you will receive information about who your contact person is a few days before arrival). Please note that there are no alcohol, tobacco or drugs are allowed at the school or the boarding school. Smoking is prohibited on the whole school area.

The usual school day at Axxell is 8.30-16.00. Mostly we will follow the regular schooldays. But some days we will have different starting or ending times. We will inform you when that will be. You are also very welcome to take part in the evening activities arranged for the students at Axxell Brusaby

Assessment: Besides following lessons and doing practical work, you will get assignments that you can do individually or in mixed groups, with students from the different schools. On the last day there will be a presentation of the finished assignment.




Overview of unit material



3. Theory about Finnsheep

There are 5 days of theoretical lessons about sheep farming and Finnsheep, however most of these days will also include practical work in the sheep stables. Below you can read the purpose and subjects about these lessons. During the lessons students will get different assignments that they will do either individually or in groups. Before each assignments the students will get guidelines from the teacher or the staff working at the sheep stables. Below you see a draft of a lesson plan for the two weeks. However, changes are possible depending on the teacher in charge of the course.

Presentations/lessons

The students prepare their "learning portfolios" on the assignments that they will get from the teacher or the staff at the sheep stable. The students will then be able to take home their learning portfolios to show the skills and knowledge developed during this learning unit. Students will collect the information for their learning portfolio based on given materials and practical workshops.

4. Theoretical assignments

The students will receive one theoretical assignment that will consist of 5 parts. The assignment is to collect and develop a learning portfolio (can be a powepoint, a vlog, a video presentation etc) that consists of information of theory and lessons learnt during the visit to Axxell Brusaby. You can read more about the 4 assignments included in the learning portfolio above in the "3. Theory about Finnsheep". The 5th part consists of the presentation's students will give on the final day before departure. The theoretical assignments will end with a short online evaluation that the students will do anonymously.
